## **General Rules and Regulations**

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Entries: Entries accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. All entries must be postmarked by the <u>closing date</u>. Each entry must include the attached Entry Form, Waiver and Release of Liability and Federation Entry agreement, filled in with names, membership numbers and signatures. Federation Entry Agreement must be signed by rider, owner, trainer, and coach if applicable. Minors (riders under 18 years old) must have a parent or guardian sign both documents requiring signatures. Missing signatures on either document constitute an incomplete entry. Also, each entry must include copies of membership cards for rider, owner, trainer (and coach if applicable), for USEF, USDF, and CDS, as well as the horse's ID's for USEF and USDF, and "proof of vaccination" per USEF Rule GR845.

Each entry must include a check or money order for the proper amount. Entries missing any of the above may be subject to additional fees. Entries accepted by USPS, FED EX, UPS, or personal/hand-delivery only, and acceptance will be based on the post mark/hand-delivery date.

Numbers will not be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and current copies of all membership/registration cards and proof of vaccination, per USEF Rule GR845. Always bring your cards to the show with you. All entries must include an emergency contact name and phone number for rider. Management reserves the right to accept conditionally, or cancel, any entries, disqualify riders as exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel or combine award classes.

**Entry Acceptance:** The show management may close entries early if the show is full. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the Wait List - competitors will be informed of their entry status. Entries submitted that are not accepted will be returned (full refund).

**Entry Confirmations:** Entry confirmations will be emailed. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.

**Refunds, Scratches, Changes:** It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show secretary via phone at (209) 696-0709 of their intention to scratch. Refunds are given for scratches prior to closing date, less the \$50.00 office fee. **No refunds will be given after the closing date without a written veterinary certificate, less the \$50.00 office fee, and any late fees, and only if the ride time is filled from the waiting list. Changes to entries or other changes made after the closing date, will be assessed a \$25.00 fee. Shows will be held rain or shine. If the show is cancelled, due to a "Force Majeure" or emergency, 50% of fees will be refunded. If class(s) are cancelled, due to a "Force Majeure" or emergency, 50% of class entry fee for class(s) not yet ridden, will be refunded.** 

**Ride Times:** Ride times will be emailed. It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Ride times will also be posted at the show office by noon the day prior to the start of the show. Scheduling is at the discretion of management, however, upper levels will generally be scheduled in the mornings, with lower levels following in order, into the afternoon. Classes may begin as early as 8:00 am. Classes may be split by rider status at the discretion of management.

**Non-competing horses:** Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when out of the stall. Entry form and signed Waiver and Federation Agreement must be submitted and appropriate fees must be paid prior to the horse being ridden. Failure to register and pay for schooling horse can result in penalty fees. Non-competing horses are allowed in the warm-up as long as there is room and their presence is not disruptive. This determination will be made solely at the discretion of the show management and/or TD. Schooling of horses is not allowed in or around the competition arena during the competition.

**Freestyles**: Freestyle entries must have a copy of their eligibility/qualifying test with entry. See USEF RULE DR 129.9 Entries submitted without their eligibility test will be considered an incomplete entry. Freestyle music must be on compact disk (CD). Please give the CD to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. For all other methods of music, the rider must provide their own connection cord and have an assistant who is responsible for managing all aspects of the music. Contact show secretary to coordinate.

**Arenas:** Outdoor competition arena (20m x 60m) with sand footing. There are two warm-up arenas available with sand footing - one outdoor (20m x 60m) and one indoor (20m x 40m). Competition Arena will close for the evening at 5 PM on Friday and Saturday for grooming and next-day show preparation. **Longeing**: Only allowed in designated longeing arena.

**Stabling:** Permanent indoor stalls (10' x 12') are fully enclosed, and doors *must* remain fully closed, except when handler is present - no stall guards. We also have a limited number of covered paddocks (16' x 24') that allow the horse to put its head out (but safely isolated from adjacent horses). Stabling requests should be included with all entries along with any unusual requirements, (i.e., stallion separation, etc.). Preference for paddock stalls will go to long term volunteers/sponsors first and everyone else on a first come first served based on receipt of entry. Arrival prior to the official opening of stabling is allowed. Please contact the barn manager to arrange times and dates (Laurel Bruun at (831) 245-9686)

If you are purchasing additional shavings, please do so in advance with your entry. No straw allowed.

**Isolation Protocol** (**Horse**): This show has an 'Isolation Protocol' in place. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease must follow the 'Isolation Protocol' which may incur a fee of \$150.00. We recommend you take your horse's temperature before you come to the showgrounds.

**Isolation Protocol** (**COVID 19**): Anyone found with a temperature of 99.5 F or with other COVID-19 symptoms who cannot immediately leave the competition grounds will be placed in a local isolation location per the Osierlea Dressage COVID-19 Emergency Plan, until such time as arrangements can be made for the person to leave the property.

**SafeSport:** All USEF and Senior Active members as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirements.to be eligible to participate in competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention policies. More information about these standards can be found at www.usef.org.

**Signs, Barriers and Parking:** Signs must be obeyed – ignoring signs will not be tolerated. Parking areas will be marked and directed by signs. Barriers must be respected - moving or removing a barrier is prohibited. Signs and Barriers are not just a courtesy issue – they are for everyone's **safety**, as well as **courtesy** to others.

**Dogs:** Dogs are welcome at Osierlea but please use common sense and common courtesy. Dogs must be on leash at all times. **Do NOT leave dogs unsupervised in locked vehicles.** The dog owner is financially liable/responsible for any upsets or injuries caused by their dog to people and/or horses. It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform friends and family of these rules, if they come with a dog to watch the competition.

**Management:** The Horse Show Management, in accordance with USEF rules, reserves the right to: (1) refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, (2) deny stabling requests, (3) disqualify riders or exhibitors, (4) prohibit exhibition of entries, (5) cancel/award prizes without claim to damage, (6) to change, cancel or combine any classes, (7) reschedule classes in accordance with USEF rules, (8) substitute officials, and (9) change arenas. The judge's decisions are strictly their own, and the management accepts no responsibility for those decisions.

Every entry must comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and its management, officials, employees and volunteers, blameless for any injury or loss to themselves, their horses, employees, and equipment, which may occur from accident, sickness, fire, natural disaster, or otherwise.

Exhibitors are hereby notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, rider, or groom or family member or friend, shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

SHARPS CONTAINERS: GR1210.4: Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. Sharps Containers are located inside the covered arena next to tack room.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for

any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

WAIVING OF COATS DR120 Dress: In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described below. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. (Please note that coats will be waived based on weather conditions and will be posted and/or announced at the show.)

HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

**GR845 EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: 1.** At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

## USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

## PLEASE READ THIS BEFORE YOU COMPLETE YOUR ENTRY FORM.

☐ BIOSECURITY MEASURES WILL BE IN PLACE FOR THIS SHOW DUE TO THE VSV OUTBREAK IN CALIFORNIA. THESE MEASURES WILL INCLUDE:

- 1) Temperature logs for two times per day temps will be sent out before the show and will need to be presented when you arrive at the facility. Please start taking temps 10 days prior to arriving at the show grounds and continue to take temps while on the show grounds.
- 2) You must obtain a health certificate from your vet 2 to 5 days before you depart from your facility. The certificate needs to include the following statement from your vet: "I have examined the animal(s) represented on this certificate of veterinary inspection and have found no clinical signs of vesicular stomatitis and they have not originated from a premises under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis."
- 3) A vet or vet technician will meet you at the gate of Osierlea and will examine your horses for any signs of the virus (signs of lesions around the mouth). This will mean limited days/hours for arrival at the show. Those hours are TBD and will be announced.
- 4) If restrictions are lifted, you will be notified via email.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

## Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
  sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
  Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
  exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,

- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

## Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

## 2024 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at <a href="https://www.usdf.org">www.usdf.org</a>. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

## Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

## Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating\* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

## Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
   A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

## Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
   For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

Dressage is a classical method of rating horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are in proved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership and the rider without the use of a rec. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired parmons are competitived.

the rules pertaining to the secompetition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. In tend, the emphasis is a part, or ming and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or have the subject. It played.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
